

Montreal, November 15, 2022 – The 6th International Digital Art Biennial (BIAN), organized by ELEKTRA returns starting December 1, 2022, at Arsenal Contemporary Art Montreal. The BIAN, a major exhibition dedicated to contemporary digital art presented since 2012, will be held until February 5, 2023.

Following the success of the last edition, the curatorship of the 6th BIAN continues to explore the idea of METAMORPHOSIS, focusing more specifically on the process of MUTATION.





6th International Digital Art Biennial (BIAN) December 1, 2022, to February 5, 2023

Founded in 1999, ELEKTRA presents and promotes works created at the intersections of contemporary art and new technologies, inscribed in the latest aesthetic currents of research and experimentation. Its main activities are: the ELEKTRA International Digital Art Festival which showcases audiovisual, immersive, participatory and robotic artistic performances since 1999. The International Digital Art Biennial (BIAN), created in 2012, is a large exhibition featuring unique and innovative works at the intersections of new technologies and contemporary artistic creation. As an addition to its first virtual exhibitions, in 2022 ELEKTRA opened the EVM - Elektra Virtual Museum - a unique and constantly reinvented 3D museum space where modeled works of local and international artists are exhibited.

Arsenal Contemporary Art is a private contemporary art and cultural initiative founded by patrons Pierre and Anne-Marie Trahan. It is devoted to the support, promotion and development of Canadian contemporary art through diverse endeavors, including the showcase of Canadian contemporary artists, alongside international artists, in exhibitions that are curated in-house and by invited international curators. Opened in 2011 in Montreal, Arsenal Contemporary Art has since expanded to include locations in Toronto (2013) and New York (2017, 2022). Although some exhibitions travel from one location to another, the programming of each location is tailored to its respective community, space and audience.
